To the scribes, the Mosaic Law was the greatest, fullest, and most perfect revelation of God's will that could ever be given. However, in the Judaism of Jesus' day there was a double tendency: to expand the Mosaic Law into hundreds of rules and regulations and to condense the 613 precepts of the Torah into a single sentence. Jesus gave a straightforward answer, quoting directly from the Law itself, startling them, and demonstrating Jesus' profound simplicity and mastery of the law of God and its purpose. Citing the first sentence of the Jewish Shema prayer: "Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Dt 6:4), Jesus then added its complementary law: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Lv 19:18). True religion, Jesus says, is loving God in Himself, and in the the bulker bulker in complementary to the only way a person can domentaria to perform.





others by loving service. That is, the only way a person can demonstrate real love for God is by showing genuine, active love for neighbor. The "great commandment in the Law" is threefold: We are commanded (1) to love God, (2) to love our neighbor, and (3) to love ourselves. We are to love God, for it is in loving Him that we are brought to the perfection of His image in us. We are to love our neighbor and ourselves as well, because both of us bear God's image, and to honor God's image is to honor Him who made it. We are to love our neighbor and our self as a way to love God: God gives us our neighbors to love so that we may learn to love Him.

Unfortunately, due to the natural human instinct of self-preservation, pride, and selfishness (the "ego" or "I"), it seems practically impossible to love neither God nor our neighbor. However, Christ is not asking us to do what He could not do. The good news is that Christ knows it is possible. If it were not so, He would not have commanded us to love. So, to love God and our neighbor as ourselves is a "debt," we owe and must pay. "Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law". (Rom 13: 8).

So, like Christ, our eternal high priest, when we offer this sacrifice and debt of love that gives perfect glory to God, we can sing with the psalmist: "I love you, Lord, my strength."

THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

First Reading:

"Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength."

Psalm:

I love you, Lord, my strength.

Second Reading:

But Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away.

Gospel:

"The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than [this]."

Gospel Meditation:

Americans have long been fascinated with public debates. Farmers stood in muddy fields for hours to hear Lincoln and Douglas dispute each other in the 1860 presidential run-up. The televised debate between Kennedy and Nixon in 1960 fascinated the nation. These days, cable news outlets and social media parse every word spoken by candidates. We still love seeing public, rational disputes in the service of our nation.

In his day, Jesus also captured attention as a public debater. Mark tells us, **"And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, 'Which commandment is the first of all?"** Jesus' brief but all-encompassing response is the double command to love God and neighbor. Notice that he includes the importance of loving God with **"all your mind."** Loving God is not simply a question of affection, loyalty, good deeds, and religious dedication. It demands honest and intense intellectual engagement — just like an accomplished debater.

How do we do this practically? One simple way is by embracing ourselves as life-long learners. Setting aside time for reading, book studies, online classes, and, perhaps most difficult, engaging in open, honest, and curious conversation with those who think differently from us. These are all great ways to love God with our minds. Our country and our Church depend greatly on souls who love God in this way with their minds. Let's commit to loving God with all our minds in tireless pursuit of truth. Daily Readings


